How the School Works

Class Organisation

We have ten classes in the school as well as a Learning Centre and a Nursery. Each year classes have to be organised on the basis of the school roll, the balance of pupils in each stage and the needs of the pupils.

Positive Behaviour and Celebrating Success

Lincluden Primary School is committed to implementing a positive behaviour management policy which encourages pupils to behave responsibly, co-operate with each other and show concern for others at all times.

Discipline originates from mutual respect for each other. Our approach is to praise pupils being good and reward them with encouragement rather than have the emphasis on bad behaviour.

We have many reward systems in place to encourage positive behaviour and to celebrate success. Respect Award, Pupil of the Week, Maths Star, Star Writer and Wider Achievements are recognised and celebrated every Friday at assembly, and house points are given to pupils who demonstrate following the Code of Conduct. Pupils and staff have drawn up a code of conduct together to promote positive behaviour.

Lincluden Primary Code of Conduct

We also have a range of sanctions if pupils do not manage to keep to the code of conduct. These include:

Detention

Detention is earned if a child chooses the wrong behaviour in the playground. A detention means the child cannot go out for break but instead reports to a specified class. On most occasions one detention is given. However for more serious issues more than one detention may be earned. If a child is on detention frequently, parents will be contacted and strategies agreed on.

Time Out

If a child ignores repeated warnings from a member of staff they can be sent for time out in another class. This allows the child to reflect on their behaviour.

Support Class

If a child returns from time out and chooses to continue the inappropriate behaviour they will have earned support class. Support class is also earned if a serious incident occurs. This will be up to a full school day in another class and parents will be contacted about this.

School uniform

All Pupils are expected to wear the school uniform each day.

Lincluden Primary School Uniform

Turquoise sweatshirt – with Lincluden logo for P1-6 pupils

Red sweatshirt with school logo for P7 pupils only

White shirt/polo shirt – white polo with school logo available but plain white shirts are fine too

Grey, black or navy trousers / skirt

Trainers/shoes/boots - without elevated heels

Turquoise and red striped, black school tie (optional)

ALL CLOTHING SHOULD BE CLEARLY MARKED WITH THE PUPIL'S NAME

Pupils should bring a pair of indoor shoes (not slippers) to change into for use inside the building. These can be kept in school overnight.

Clothes for P.E.

Shorts, socks and T-shirt – not the same clothes being worn during the day.

Pre-ordering lunch

All menus are nutritionally analysed, offering a fantastic choice and flexibility. Primary schools have introduced an advanced pre order system for lunch. Pre order forms are handed out to all pupils.

Special dietary requirements

Free School Meals

Free School Meals are provided for all pupils in Primary 1, 2 and 3. Younger children at nursery or older pupils at primary may also be eligible for free school meals in certain situations as well as those families on qualifying benefits.

Attendance

It is your responsibility as parents to ensure that your child/children attend school regularly. For the safety of all children it is important for you to telephone the school office prior to/at the beginning of the absence. Absences are recorded in class registers and frequent or irregular absences not supported by a reasonable excuse, will be notified to parents and the matter may be referred to the Opportunities for All Service. If possible please, try to make dental/medical appointments outwith school hours. However, if this is not possible please inform us in writing or by telephone of the appointment and arrange to collect your child from class.

Absence from School

Pupils who need to leave school during the school day ie doctor /dentist appointments, must be collected by a named contact confirmed with the school office. They must also report to the school office on their return to school.

Curriculum for Excellence

Curriculum for Excellence (CfE) is bringing learning to life in the way education is delivered for all 3-18year olds – in nursery, primary, secondary, at college, workplace or community learning. It aims to raise standards, improve knowledge and develop skills, closing the gap between the lowest and highest performers. Ultimately it aims to nurture children and young people as successful learners, confident individuals, effective contributors and responsible citizens.

Broad General Education

Children and young people work their way through Experiences and Outcomes in each of the five Curriculum Levels (Early, First, Second, Third, Fourth) and in each of the eight Curricular Areas. The five Curricular Levels span pre-school to the end of S3. This is the Broad General Education. Pupils progress at their own pace, working through the Experiences and Outcomes of the most appropriate level for them. Pupils will be supported in collecting evidence of their achievements, with a profile of these being produced in P7 and S3.

What will the children be taught at Lincluden Primary School?

The framework we are following is the Scottish Curriculum – Curriculum for Excellence. It provides interesting, relevant, challenging and enjoyable experiences which will help prepare children for the challenges of life in the 21st century.

All pupils will take part in the eight areas of the school curriculum.

Literacy and English – includes reading, writing, talking and listening. Children will all have experience of a modern foreign language which is currently French.

Numeracy – includes number, money and measurement; shape, position and movement; information handling.

Expressive Arts – includes music, drama, dance and art and design.

Social Studies – includes people, place and environment; people, past events and societies; people, society, economy and business.

Technologies – includes technological developments in society in the modern world, ICT to enhance learning, craft, design and contexts for developing ICT.

Religious and Moral Education – includes Christianity, other world religions and development of beliefs and values.

Health and Well-being – includes mental, emotional, social and physical wellbeing; physical education and sport; relationships and making informed choices.

Sciences – includes Planet Earth, Forces, Electricity and Waves, Biological Systems and Materials.

Pupils will be encouraged to achieve in areas beyond the formal curriculum and there are numerous opportunities for this in Lincluden. Our 'Have a Go' sessions for P4-7 give the children the chance to develop skills for learning, life and work as well as building relationships beyond their own class. P5-7 Responsibility Groups encourage pupil leadership, responsibility, develop responsible citizens and effective contributors.

Home/School Partnership/Parental Involvement and Engagement

Parent Council and Parent Forum

Every parent who has a child at our school is a member of the Parent Forum. The parent council is a group of parents who have chosen to represent the parent forum. As a member of the Parent Forum, each parent can expect to:

- Receive information about the school and its activities
- Hear about what partnership with parents means in our school
- Be invited to be involved in ways and times that suit you
- Identify issues you want the parent council to work on with the school
- Be asked your opinion by the parent council on issues relating to the school and education it provides
- Work in partnership with staff
- Enjoy taking part in school life in whatever way possible

Homework/Family Learning

Homework is an opportunity for parents and children to work together and to have some fun with learning.

Children at all stages of the school may be sent home with small tasks such as learning spelling, preparing reading or completing maths tasks. Sometimes children will be asked to work on small research projects.

You can help by playing the fun activities with your child and by providing a regular place and time to be set aside for homework. Such a place should be well lit and comfortable, yet free from distractions like television and radio.

If your child has difficulty with homework, please write a note to the teacher in the homework jotter. Sometimes misunderstandings arise between children and parents about methods to be used. If you are in any doubt, get in touch with the class teacher.

We also run a homework club after school where pupils can receive additional input once a week. Class teachers will discuss this with you.

Family Learning

Research shows that one of the most effective ways of raising attainment for children is to maximise parental involvement in children's education. We have monthly Shared Finish sessions where all parents are encouraged to come along and be involved in their child's learning. Nursery and P1/2 also run Stay and Play sessions where parents are encouraged to come along and join in with their child's learning.



How is my child doing?

There will be several opportunities for you to discuss your child's progress. This may be through informal discussion with the teacher or at Parents' Nights/ Learning Conversations, formal reports or for some it may be through more formal, focussed meetings with other agencies.

School Improvements

In May/June of each year, the school publishes a Standards & Quality Report providing all stakeholders with a comprehensive summary of the school's work and learners' achievements over the last year. The first part of this report provides an overview of the school's progress in addressing its key priorities, while the second part gives information about, for example, how well pupils are learning and achieving; how well the school is supporting children/young people to develop and learn. In June, we publish a School Improvement Plan which outlines the key priorities for the school during the year ahead, following engagement with staff, pupils and parents.



School Improvement Plan2019-2020

- 1. A continued focus on raising the attainment of our learners, with a focus on Science and Technology.
- Lincluden staff will work together to review our Science and Technology programmes. We will work with cluster staff to offer a wider range of learning experiences including using the Bridge.
- Lincluden staff will share ideas and work with a number of schools in our cluster and across Ayrshire.
- We will work on developing a better understanding of the data from SNSA assessments enabling us to support pupils.
- We will use Pupil Equity Funding to deliver interventions including Closing the Literacy Gap, Number Boost and TLQ to help individual pupils improve.
- We will reorganise the school library to encourage pupils to read for enjoyment.
- 2. Developing parental engagement in our children's learning.
- We will continue to develop the 'Stay and Build' parent events throughout the school.
- Nursery staff will arrange visits for families to use the local area.
- 3. Improving pupils' health and wellbeing.
- Lincluden staff will use outdoor learning and activities to improve pupils' health and engagement with their learning.
- Use Pupil Equity Funding to pay for swim passes, encouraging pupils to stay active in the school holidays.
- Revise our anti-bullying policy to promote respect and positive relationships.

Emergency Procedures

If your child feels ill during the school day and we feel that he/she would be better at home, we will telephone you or your emergency contact.
