

Key statistics - Main Settlements

Some details about the main towns and villages in the Stranraer and the Rhins Ward are given below

Cairnryan was established in 1701 and is a small village with a population of 142 which lies on the Eastern shore of Loch Ryan, 6 miles (10km) north of Stranraer. The linear village looks across the A77 North, It is home to P&O Ferries and Stena Line Companies which sail to both Larne and Belfast respectively and is the is the shortest sea crossing to Northern Ireland. The village has a public hall, toilets, campsite and B&B accommodation.

Drummore is identified as a Local Centre in the Stranraer Housing Market Area with a population of 310. It lies to the south of Stranraer on the A716, and has a range of facilities including a harbour, public house/ restaurant and shop. It also lies within the Rhins Coast Regional Scenic Area. It is the gateway to the Mull of Galloway Trust tourist attractions including an operational lighthouse.

Kirkcolm is identified as a Local Centre in the Stranraer Housing Market Area. It is located to the north of Stranraer overlooking Loch Ryan. The settlement is located within the Rhins Coast Regional Scenic Area. The village has a shop, bowling green, public hall and hotel/restaurant.

Leswalt is identified as a Local Centre in the Stranraer Housing Market Area. It is located north west of Stranraer in the upper Rhins area and has a number of facilities including a hall and shop.

Portpatrick is located south west of Stranraer on the A77 road and overlooks the Irish Sea. The settlement contains a number of historic buildings which are included within the Conservation Area. It is a popular tourist destination and a busy harbour town with facilities that include a primary school, public hall, bowling green, tennis courts, shops and restaurants. The Portpatrick Harbour Benefits Society have recently bought over the harbour and transferred assets including land at the ward shore and the public toilets. The town had population of 534 in 2011 and is identified as a Local Centre in the Stranraer Housing Market Area.

Stranraer has a population of 10,593. It is the second largest town in Dumfries and Galloway and the largest in Wigtownshire. It is identified as a District Centre in the Stranraer Housing Market Area and functions as the main service centre for the western part of the region. The town contains a number of facilities including a community hospital, leisure centre, a wide range of shops including supermarkets, a library and museum as

well as many other businesses. It is located on the banks of Loch Ryan and has good access onto the A75 and A77 trunk roads.

Sandhead is identified as a Local Centre in the Stranraer Housing Market Area. It lies to the south of Stranraer on the A716, overlooking Luce Bay. The settlement offers a number of facilities including primary school, bowling green, shop and cafe.

Public Health Improvement

The Public Health Improvement (PHI) workforce is part of the Community Health and Social Care Directorate. One PHI team works regionally, in partnership with Health and Social Care, Third Sector, Local Authority and communities to agree strategic direction and lead on action to deliver a regional plan to improve population health and wellbeing. With a focus on reducing health inequalities, the regional PHI plan includes poverty and inequalities; food insecurity; mental health and wellbeing; tobacco, alcohol and drug use prevention and harm reduction; physical activity/ re-ablement; diet and healthy weight; housing and homelessness; workplace health; children and young people's health and wellbeing; digital equality.

All other PHI practitioners are being located within 8 Home Teams developing across the region and will be focusing activity on early intervention and prevention with vulnerable communities and individuals; delivering and developing the Community Link Service; proactively engaging with colleagues, communities and partners to build and strengthen a 'community led' regional approach to PHI using community development methodology; and providing support for specific actions within the PHI Regional Plan and priority PHI issues.

NHS Home Teams

Home Teams will be fully integrated, multidisciplinary teams placed at the heart of the community who will work closely with people, their family, friends, carers and the wider local community and services to enable people to live healthy and active lives and live at home for longer.

They will support people within their community to live at home, close to their home or in a homely setting, preventing hospital admission where appropriate or safely bring them home from hospital earlier. A "Home First" approach is the default position for everyone. Home Teams will also ensure that people are at the heart of any decisions and will encourage people to improve and maintain their health and wellbeing through good conversations.
