"Investing in developing the skills of our workforce through apprenticeships is a vital part of how we deliver our service and all levels of the nursery team, from Childcare assistants to senior management, are undertaking some form of training."

One of the nursery's employees, started working towards her SVQ level 4 Social Services (Children and Young People) last year and is now a manager with responsibility for training her own team. She said "The skills I have gained through my MA have given me the tools and confidence to mentor and support my own trainees, which includes delivering training sessions to help them enhance their knowledge."



I took up an Early Years Practitioners post with some private childcare providers before I went to work as a Support Assistant with the Speech and Language Therapy Unit. I loved working there, however due to the part time nature of the work I eventually moved to another post in Edinburgh.

Throughout this time I maintained a place on Dumfries and Galloway Council's register for supply staff, I heard about my current position and got the opportunity to work on a brand new initiative in Dumfries through the setup of a pilot project of working with two year olds in a nursery school setting. I am excited about working on this new development.

- You will be required to register with SSSC and hold an HNC/SCQF @ Level 7 in a Childcare Practice Award.
- To implement the curricular programme by delivering activities for young children, in line with national and local standards.
- · Contribute to the planning of a curricular programme which meets the needs of the individual child, in line with National and Local standards.

Manager

(Salary range £31.797 - £34.200)

- You will be required to hold a childhood practice degree or equivalent and register with SSSC as a Manager of Day Care Children's Services.
