Post Graduate Awards	<p>Section 32 - The governing body under this section may award scholarships for research work or for advanced or special study to persons belonging to the County who are of high attainment and promise and who have graduated at University or obtained an associateship or diploma of a central institution or a corresponding qualification of another institution provided that such persons require financial aid to undertake such research work or advanced or special study.</p> <p>The candidates are required to submit for the approval of the governing body a programme of the work or study to be undertaken and the scholarship shall be tenable for one year.</p>	9 November
Supplementary Bursaries to Students	Section 33 – This is open to applicants who are about to enter or who are in attendance at a University, Central Institution or College of Education.	9 November
Special Awards for Mature Students	Section 34 – Open to applicants 21 years of age or over who have left school at too early a stage of their education to obtain the qualifications necessary to entitle them to enter a Scottish University, Central Institution or College of Education, or who since obtaining such a qualification have either been engaged in remunerative employment or been unable to, for reasons acceptable to the Governing body, to enter such University, Institution or College.	24 August
Assistance in Obtaining Practical Experience of Trades	Section 35 – Open to applicants undertaking apprenticeships or work experience to enable them to pay expenses including any fees, necessary books, instruments, tools, kit or personal equipment.	1 June
Travel Scholarships	Section 37 – Open to applicants to enable them to travel out of Scotland to University, College, Educational Institution or Centre approved by the Governing body.	1 June
Travel Grants	Section 38 – Open to applicants to enable them to travel in either Great Britain or abroad for any purpose of an educational nature.	1 June
Promoting Education in Visual Arts	Section 46 – Open to applicants who shows exceptional promise in any of the visual arts and who require financial aid to enable them to obtain special tuition or to pursue private study.	24 August
Promoting Education in Music	Section 47 – Open to applicants who show exceptional promise in vocal or instrumental music and who require financial aid to enable them to acquire, where necessary or desirable, a musical instrument and to obtain special tuition or to pursue private study.	24 August
Promoting Education in Drama	Section 48 – Open to applicants who show exceptional promise in dramatic art and who require financial aid to enable them to obtain special tuition or to pursue private study.	24 August
