## COMMERCIAL DAY BOARDING ESTABLISHMENT CONDITIONS \& GUIDANCE

| 1.0 | GENERAL LICENCE CONDITIONS | Guidance |
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| 1.1 | Unless otherwise stated, these <br> conditions shall apply to all buildings <br> and areas to which the dogs have <br> access and / or which are used in <br> association with the commercial day <br> boarding of dogs. | The applicant shall ensure that all <br> relevant planning and building <br> control permissions are obtained. <br> The separation distance between <br> commercial day boarding and noise <br> sensitive premises is an important <br> consideration to avoid incompatible <br> development. |
| 1.2 | The licence holder must not change, <br> cause or permit to be made any <br> material change to the premises or <br> licensed activity without the prior <br> consent of the Local Authority. | Adequate insurance indemnity should <br> be arranged by the operator of the <br> premises. This should be maintained <br> at a sufficient level to cover the <br> maximum number of dogs boarded. |
| Control, Custody and Care <br> insurance is recommended if dogs <br> are to be taken outwith the <br> establishment (e.g. for walks). |  |  |
| 1.3 | Adequate Employers Liability and <br> Public Liability Insurance shall be <br> provided. <br> Certificates of insurance shall be <br> displayed in a prominent position. |  |

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| 1.6 | No animals, other than dogs, are to be boarded at the facility. |  |
| 1.7 | Dogs are not permitted to be boarded overnight. |  |
| 1.8 | A copy of the Licence and its conditions must be suitably displayed to the public in a prominent position at the boarding establishment. All dog owners must be made aware of where the Licence is displayed and the conditions attached to the Licence. |  |

| 1.11 | The premises shall be operated in such a way as to avoid statutory nuisance to occupiers of neighbouring properties. | The Licensee should minimise the potential of noise and odour issues. In particular, dog barking may be an issue. |

External exercise areas must be sufficiently secure to prevent persons not connected to or employed by the establishment having access to the dogs. |  |
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| 2.6 | Wood should not be used in exposed construction of walls, floors, partitions, door frames or doors within the dog indoor common area. Where wood has been used in existing construction it must be smooth and treated to render it impervious. All internal surfaces used in the construction of walls, floors, partitions, doors and door frames to be durable, smooth and impervious and capable of being easily cleaned and disinfected where necessary. There must be no projections or rough edges liable to cause injury. | The purpose of avoiding wood is due to the possibility of damage to the surface due to scratching. Damaged wood is difficult to keep clean and splinters can cause injury to the dogs. |
| 2.7 | All structural exterior wood ie fence posts must be properly treated against wood rot, eg tanalised. Only non-toxic products may be used. <br> Wood is not permitted for agility or play equipment. |  |
| 2.8 | Junctions between the walls and floors in areas used by dogs shall be coved to facilitate cleaning. Where it is impractical to do this, all joints must be sealed. |  |
| 2.9 | All internal furnishings shall be maintained in a sound condition to permit thorough cleaning and disinfection and shall be of a material capable of being cleaned. Such furnishings shall be inspected on a daily basis for damage or disrepair. Any damaged or ripped items of | Leather or vinyl furnishings provided they are in good repair are acceptable. Exposed wood, even in good condition can be chewed resulting in splinters and should therefore be avoided. |

Internal <br> drainage to be adequate to prevent <br> ponding of water. | In new constructions it is <br> recommended that floors are laid to <br> a minimum fall of 1 in 80 leading to <br> a shallow drainage channel or <br> effectively covered deep drainage <br> channel. |


| 4.0 | KITCHEN FACILITIES | Guidance |
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| 4.1 | A separate area clearly demarked <br> and hygienically constructed shall be |  |

| 5.0 | WATER SUPPLY | Guidance |
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| 5.1 | Fresh drinking water from a potable <br> source must be available at all times <br> and changed frequently throughout <br> the day. Drinking vessels must be <br> capable of being easily cleaned and <br> disinfected and must be cleaned at <br> least once per day and maintained in <br> a clean condition. |  |


| 6.0 | CLEANLINESS | Guidance |
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| 6.1 | All indoor areas used by dogs must <br> be kept clean and free from <br> accumulations of dirt and must be <br> kept in such a manner as to be <br> conducive to maintenance of disease <br> control and dog comfort. Food <br> preparation / storage areas shall be <br> maintained in a clean condition. |  |
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| 6.2 | All excreta and soiled material must <br> be removed immediately from <br> communal areas used by dogs and <br> as soon as practicable from the <br> isolation kennel(s) or other areas <br> used to house dogs. |  |
| 6.3 | All fittings, bedding and towels must <br> be thoroughly cleaned as required. | If vet bed material is used on the <br> premises it should be laundered on <br> a frequent basis and between use <br> by different dogs. |
| 6.4 | Facilities must be provided for the <br> proper reception, storage and <br> disposal of all waste. Arrangements <br> must be made with the Waste <br> Collection Authority or a waste <br> management contractor authorised <br> for the purposes of the duty of care, <br> for removal of waste from the <br> establishment under the <br> Environmental Protection Act 1990. |  |
| 6.5 | All cleaning chemicals and materials <br> used must not be harmful to dogs and <br> must be stored in a secure cupboard <br> or cabinet. | Measures must be taken to minimise <br> the risks from rodents, insects, and <br> other pests within the establishment. |

| 7.0 | TEMPERATURE | Guidance |
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| 7.1 | Suitable and safe means shall be <br> provided for heating the common <br> indoor area(s) or section of the indoor <br> area sufficient in size to <br> accommodate the number of dogs | The common indoor area may be <br> heated using panel heaters or <br> infrared halogen heaters. |


|  | being boarded. This area should be <br> heated according to the requirements <br> of individual dogs. |
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| 7.2 | A maximum temperature of $26^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ <br> (79ㄷ) should not to be exceeded in <br> normal circumstances. <br> Dogs must always have free access <br> to an area where the temperature <br> does not fall below $10^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$. This should <br> equate to 1 square metre per dog. |
| 7.3 | Adequate shade shall be provided in <br> outdoor area(s) to protect animals <br> from direct sunshine. Adequate <br> shelter shall also be provided to <br> protect against inclement weather. |

In addition to heating, coats and jackets can be used to help maintain a comfortable temperature for individual dogs.

It is accepted that if dogs access external areas of the establishment, they may be exposed to temperatures below $10^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ on a regular basis.

Shading should be sufficient to allow all dogs accommodated outside at any time to protect themselves from the direct rays of the sun and prevent overheating. Shade may be provided by means of a canopy, parasols or other suitable alternative and should be positioned so as to provide maximum protection.

This must be kept up to date and shall be available for inspection at all reasonable times for the purpose of checking numbers of dogs on the premises, details of any sick dog, any medication administered etc. <br> Details shall be kept for a minimum period of 24 months. |

It is important for the licensing officer to ensure that dogs will not be kept in vehicles for unnecessary or unreasonable periods of time and, in particular, dogs should not be left unsupervised in vehicles.

First aid kits for dogs must be kept well stocked. These should be available in each vehicle used for the transportation of boarded dogs. Advice on the contents should be sought from a veterinary officer.
