1. These premises, formerly known as the Railway Inn, are situated on two floors, with toilet accommodation on each floor. The function room is on the upper floor and the bar is situated on the ground floor.

1.1 The total capacity for the premises is 400 persons.

- 1.2 On-sale operating hours are-
 - Monday to Wednesday 11am to 12.30am
 - Thursday to Saturday 11am to 12.30am
 - Sunday 12noon to 12.30am

1.3 The licence was transferred to Mr Ryan on 23 August 2022.

2. The new licence holder wishes to expand the operation of the business to provide bar meals within and outwith core hours.

2.1 Outwith core hours has been applied for as the premises may open for breakfasts in the future.

3. The application also involves a change to the terms and times for admission of children and young persons.

3.1 This is to allow persons under 18 years of age to access the premises in line with the Board's Licensing Policy.

4. The application was advertised on the Board's website page from Tuesday 6 September 2022. Simultaneously a notice must be displayed at the premises.

4.1 The Notice was checked on 6 September 2022 at which time it was displayed inside the premises. I requested the notice be moved to the front of the premises in a prominent position.

4.2 The notice was displayed on the front door of the premises on 8 September 2022.

LICENSING (SCOTLAND) ACT 2005 (THE ACT): SECTION 84A CONDUCT INCONSISTENT WITH THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES PERSONAL LICENCE HOLDER: PAUL AGNEW

1. Reason for Report

1.1 On 6 June 2022, the Chief Constable, in terms of his power under section 84A the Act, submitted to the Board a report advising that Paul Agnew, the holder of a personal licence, has acted in a manner that is inconsistent with the licensing objectives of Preventing Crime and Disorder, Securing Public Safety and Preventing Public Nuisance (Appendix).

1.2 When the Board receives a section 84A report it must hold a Hearing.

2. Background

2.1 A Personal Licence issued by a Licensing Board authorises the licence holder to supervise or authorise the sale of alcohol.

2.2 In terms of procedure, both the Police letter and Notice of Hearing have been sent to the licence holder.

3. Determination

3.1 As democratically elected individuals, ultimate decision making power rests with elected Members and not Council Officers. Whilst Officers can give advice, they cannot clearly make decisions at Hearings. Ultimately, the Board must come to a lawful decision taking into account the following:

- 3.2 At its Hearing the Board *may*, after giving
 - the licence holder concerned and
 - such other persons as they consider appropriate an opportunity to be heard and
 - if satisfied that it is necessary to do so for the purposes of any of the licensing objectives, make an order to:
 - a) revoke the licence;
 - b) suspend the licence for a maximum 6 month period as the Board considers appropriate; or
 - c) endorse the licence (an endorsement expires after five years).

3.3 It is also open to the Board to take no further action in which case Mr Agnew will continue to retain his personal licence.

3.4 If, at the Hearing, the Board is satisfied that, having regard to the licensing objectives, the licence holder *is not a fit and proper person* to be the holder of a personal licence then the Board *must* make an order revoking the licence.

4. Recommendations

4.1 Members are asked to consider whether they wish to revoke, suspend, endorse the licence or take no further action; and

4.2 Note that if a determination is made that the licence holder is not a fit and proper person to be the holder of the personal licence then the Board has no discretion as to which action it wishes to take as it must, in law, revoke the licence.

LICENSING (SCOTLAND) ACT 2005 - SECTION 84A REPORT OF CONDUCT INCONSISTENT WITH LICENSING OBJECTIVES PERSONAL LICENCE HOLDER: PAUL AGNEW, 15 CHALLOCH CRESCENT, LESWALT, DG9 0LN LICENCE NO: DG/W/0374

The Chief Constable hereby reports to the Licensing Board in terms of Section 84A of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 that Paul Agnew has acted in a manner which is inconsistent with the licensing objective(s) articulated at Section 4(1) of the Act, namely:

- Preventing Crime and Disorder
- Securing Public Safety
- Preventing Public Nuisance

Mr Agnew holds a personal licence issued by Wigtownshire Licensing Board which is due to expire on 29 June 2024. At the time of the incident being reported he held the position of Designated Premises Manager and Premises Licence Holder for the Commercial Inn, Stranraer.

The following information is provided for the Board's consideration.

About 2230 hours, on Saturday 7 May 2022, officers attended at the Commercial Inn to conduct a standard inspection. At this time they observed a male and female adult leaving the premises, highly agitated and apparent bleeding on the face of the female. The female approached the officers to inform them that she had been

assaulted by the subject Paul Agnew, immediately after Paul Agnew had been involved in an argument with her partner. The female provided further information that the subject had perpetrated the assault by punching her once to the face.

A short time later Paul Agnew was traced within the back room of the premises he was initially reluctant to speak with officers. On being asked to observe the CCTV footage Paul Agnew freely admitted to committing an assault on the female, whilst attempting to eject both parties due to their behaviour and level of intoxication.

Paul Agnew was arrested and cautioned and charged with assault, before being released to be reported to the Procurator Fiscal.

The female victim was examined at the Galloway Community Hospital where the extent of her injuries were noted as a small superficial cut to the inside of her mouth.

It should be noted that following the very initial reluctance to engage with officers Mr Agnew was fully cooperative with Police throughout.

The Chief Constable's view is that all options open to the Board under Section 84(7) or 84(7A) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 should be considered.
