SEA Screening Report

Thank you for your consultation which we received on 07 September 2022 about the above SEA Screening Report. Our understanding from the SEA Screening Report is that the Newton Stewart Conservation Area Appraisal and Management Plan provides further detail in support of Policy HE2 (Conservation Areas) in the Dumfries and Galloway Local Development Plan 2. In particular, the Conservation Area Appraisal and Management Plan assists decisionmakers in deciding how Policy HE2 (Conservation Areas) should be applied when development is proposed for properties and spaces within the Newton Stewart Conservation Area.

Given that the Dumfries and Galloway Local Development Plan 2 has already been subject to a full SEA, it is considered that the Newton Stewart Conservation Area Appraisal and Management Plan will have minimal environmental effects. Based on the


