How the School Works

Class Organisation

The school follows the Council policy for class organisation. Your child may be placed in one-stage or composite class (e.g. P4/5): in a composite class, two age groups are taught by the same teacher. When organising the classes, we consider additional support needs; gender balances, or placement of siblings.

Positive Behaviour and Celebrating Success

Everyone has a right to feel happy and secure in school. We promote a caring co-operative atmosphere in which to work and play. Our children are supervised throughout the day and there is always an adult available should children want to discuss any concerns.

Our school rules are:

- We will respect everyone and everything in our school community, including ourselves.
- We will be ready to learn and do our best.
- We will enjoy school and have fun, but remember everyone else too.

Through our House System, children can win points for their house by working well, and following the rules. Merit certificates are awarded to pupils who have shown particular achievement or effort. These are recognised in assembly and shared on our Team Tree.

We also share successes with parents through electronic Learning Passports. These include current learning successes as well as Wider Achievements where parents can record any activities outwith school so we can celebrate these with the children.

This system has proven very successful in promoting positive behaviour, but behaviour issues will still crop up from time to time. Should behavioural difficulties arise, parents will be informed and possible courses of action will be explored together. In such cases, the full support of parents is expected to ensure the child conforms to the behaviour norms in school. In the rare and serious event when all else fails, Authority Policy regarding exclusion will be followed.





School uniform

Pupils should also have:

- Suitable gym shoes;
- No football kit as these can lead to arguments;
- Jewellery will be removed for safety.

For outdoor P.E:

- Extra layers such as jogging bottoms, sweatshirt;
- Outdoor trainers;
- A waterproof.

Pre-ordering lunch

Attendance

It is your responsibility as parents to ensure that your child/children attend school regularly. For the safety of all children it is important for you to telephone the school office prior to/at the beginning of the absence. Absences are recorded in class registers and frequent or irregular absences not supported by a reasonable excuse, will be notified to parents and the matter may be referred to the Opportunities for All Service. If possible please, try to make dental/medical appointments outwith school hours. However, if this is not possible please inform us in writing or by telephone of the appointment and arrange to collect your child from class.

Absence from School

Pupils who need to leave school during the school day ie doctor /dentist appointments, must be collected by a named contact confirmed with the school office. They must also report to the school office on their return to school.

Curriculum for Excellence

Curriculum for Excellence (CfE) is bringing learning to life in the way education is delivered for all 3-18year olds – in nursery, primary, secondary, at college, workplace or community learning. It aims to raise standards, improve knowledge and develop skills, closing the gap between the lowest and highest performers. Ultimately it aims to nurture children and young people as successful learners, confident individuals, effective contributors and responsible citizens.

Broad General Education

Children and young people work their way through Experiences and Outcomes in each of the five Curriculum Levels (Early, First, Second, Third, Fourth) and in each of the eight Curricular Areas. The five Curricular Levels span pre-school to the end of S3. This is the Broad General Education. Pupils progress at their own pace, working through the Experiences and Outcomes of the most appropriate level for them. Pupils will be supported in collecting evidence of their achievements, with a profile of these being produced in P7 and S3.

The school offers a broad and varied curriculum within the Curriculum for Excellence framework, with balance across all curricular areas. We promote an active and investigative approach where children increasingly accept responsibility for their own learning.

Pupil Health and Well-being is an integral part of the curriculum, and a pupil's ability to learn. All curricular areas contribute to personal and social development: fostering positive attitudes; co-operation as well as independence and self-confidence.

Our Health and Well-being programme covers aspects of physical, social, mental and emotional health such as hygiene, exercise and healthy eating. Units on issues such as bullying, discrimination and the misuse of drugs provide children with the experiences and information to help them to make informed choices in their lives. We also teach units on Relationships, Sexual Health & Parenthood as per national guidance.

The Wider Curriculum:

We offer a wide range of extra-curricular activities throughout the year: offered by staff, Active Schools and our P6 & P7 Play Leaders. Activities that have been offered recently include: animation, football, badminton, drama and Spanish.

In Calside Primary, we aim to prepare our learners to be full citizens in society through many opportunities for the learners to participate in the life of the school. These include: Pupil Council, Eco Group, House Captains, Buddies and Peer Mediators.

We further enrich learning experiences through excursions related to learning. Recent trips have included museums, the seashore, Dynamic Earth and the Titanic exhibition in Belfast. Upper school pupils also develop their resilience during a residential experience: details of this trip are shared with parents at the time.

Every parent who has a child at our school is a member of the Parent Forum. The parent council is a group of parents who have chosen to represent the parent forum. As a member of the Parent Forum, each parent can expect to:

- Be asked your opinion by the parent council on issues relating to the school and education it provides

Homework/Family Learning

Parental support is very important and we ask that you help with learning in the following ways:

- Take a general interest in your children's homework;
- Ensure that children do not become over anxious or spend too much time on the homework task;
- Let us know if concerns have arisen so that these can be addressed by the teacher;
- Provide an environment which is suited to the child for the completion of homework;
- Where appropriate, assist your child with references/information for topic work;
- Encourage care, accuracy and tidiness in any set written homework without actually completing the task for the children;
- Encourage children to watch suitable information/news programmes which may be relevant to their schooling;
- Encourage the use of computer programmes other than games which could help support the work the children do in school.

Homework Tasks

The homework programme for the term will be advised through the termly class newsletter. If you require additional Literacy or Numeracy homework, please discuss this with your child's teacher.

How is my child doing?

There will be several opportunities for you to discuss your child's progress. This may be through informal discussion with the teacher or at Parents' Nights/ Learning Conversations, formal reports or for some it may be through more formal, focussed meetings with other agencies.

School Improvements

In May/June of each year, the school publishes a Standards & Quality Report providing all stakeholders with a comprehensive summary of the school's work and learners' achievements over the last year. The first part of this report provides an overview of the school's progress in addressing its key priorities, while the second part gives information about, for example, how well pupils are learning and achieving; how well the school is supporting children/young people to develop and learn. In June, we publish a School Improvement Plan which outlines the key priorities for the school during the year ahead, following engagement with staff, pupils and parents.

Key improvements we are currently targeting include:

- Continuing to ensure that our curriculum covers the breadth of the Curriculum for Excellence, and develops skills as well as knowledge;
- Continue to monitor our tracking systems across the curriculum to ensure continuity, progression and depth;
- Ensuring that all new staff to the school are trained in our core Literacy, Numeracy and Health & Wellbeing approaches;
- Further developing the guidance for parents as to how they can support learning at home, through parental workshops and homework guidance;
- Refining the paperwork for Support for Learning;
- Development of the electronic Learning Passports to share success, learning targets and wider achievements between home and school;

The full School Improvement Plan is available on the school website, and a summary to parents is sent through the school maildrop twice a year.

Health and Safety

Emergency Procedures

If your child feels ill during the school day and we feel that he/she would be better at home, we will telephone you or your emergency contact. Minor accidents, e.g. cuts, bruises, are dealt with by the school staff. Serious accidents are few, but should one occur your child will be immediately taken either to your doctor or to hospital, if necessary, and you or your emergency contact will be notified. We cannot stress enough the importance of supplying the school with the relevant information we require in such a situation, i.e. your own home and work number and a telephone number of an emergency contact. Please remember that if your child stays in more than one home setting contact details should take account of this.

Severe Weather and School Closure Arrangements

Headteachers are authorised to make an emergency closure when the state of the weather or any other exceptional circumstance make it necessary in the best interests of the pupils. In these circumstances parents will be communicated with in a variety of ways including text messages/ phone calls and emergency contact arrangements. All school closures will be notified on the Council Website.

As part of the process of learning we allow our children supervised access to the Internet and e-mail. The authority runs its own filter system to ensure that young people are not at risk from exposure to inappropriate material. This filtering system is regularly being upgraded.
