Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 Supplementary Guidance on Developer Contributions - Screening Report

Thank you for your Screening Report consultation which SEPA received via the Scottish Government SEA Gateway on 7 January 2016.

In accordance with Section 9(3) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 we have considered your screening report using the criteria set out in Schedule 2 for determining the likely significance of effects on the environment. Having reviewed the Screening Report, we consider that in respect of our main areas of interest (air, water, soil, human health, material assets (of which we have a specific interest in waste) and climatic factors) the Supplementary Guidance on Developer Contributions is unlikely to have significant environmental effects. Although we are of the view that significant environmental effects are not likely, it is for Dumfries & Galloway Council as Responsible Authority to make a formal determination taking into account the consultation responses received.
