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	l last night attended a public meeting in Portpatrick
	concerning the future of the village hall. More than ninety
	people were in attendance. The unanimous agreement was
	that Dumfries and Galloway Council has acted wrongly in its
0	dealings with the future of the hall and its disposal as an
6	asset. The council's practices and lack of transparency
0	concerning its transactions with the newly formed Portpatrick
	Community Development Trust came in for widespread
	criticism. I understand that officers and elected members
	of DGRC and the officers of the new Trust were invited to the
	meeting but not one was in attendance, which I find hard to
	comprehend and also alarmingly suspicious. It was made
	clear that the Trust has made no communication with the
	village until recently and has no majority support from it The
	meeting was told the Trust had only commercial aspirations
	for the hall and other village assets and its plans were not for
	the good of the village and its community. The overwhelming
	consensus of the meeting was that this Trust, even though at
	the moment the only body apparently willing to take over the
	hall, should not be allowed to do so and there was a
	unanimous vote to that effect. I am told legal advice is now
	being taken and Scottish Public Services Ombudsman is to
	be contacted. Also, it now seems possible another group will
	be formed to look into taking over the hall. Surely the
	majority voice and feelings of this village cannot be ignored by
	DGRC and the council's dealings with the Portpatrick
	Community Development Trust and the Trust's credentials
	should be fully investigated.
	I wish to register my objection to your current arrangements
	for transferring Portpatrick Village Hall.
	It is being done without the consent of the village.
	I wish to express my concern over the Stage 1 initial asset
	transfer of Portpatrick Village Hall to Portpatrick Community
	Development Trust who have initiated this without any
	consultation with the wider Portpatrick Community in breach
	of the conditions of asset transfer.
	I would like to object to the proposed asset transfer of
	Portpatrick Village Hall to a group calling themselves
	Portpatrick Community Development Trust. My objection is on
	the grounds that this group has not carried out a full
	community consultation and does not represent the wishes of
	the majority of Portpatrick or the views of our duly elected
	community council.
	I wish to register my objection to the asset transfer of
	Portpatrick village hall to the Portpatrick Community
	Development Trust. There has not been any community
	consultation on this planned transfer, and I do not believe that

	the formula process of the twenth over the second process of the
	the founding members of the trust have the welfare of the
	village or the local community as a primary aim of the
	proposed transfer.

6	few years indicates they are not the people to develop the use
	of the village hall for the greater good of those living in
	Portpatrick.
	They have shown themself to be unreliable and misleading in
	all respects concerning the hall, both current and projected.
	I therefore lodge this objection to their appointment to
	manage the hall for two years prior to a possible asset
	transfer to them.

	have had no involvement with the Community of Portpatrick

	become apparent through a Freedom of Information
	request that the aforementioned Portpatrick Community
	Development Trust intends to pursue further asset
	transfers for village community facilities. I also object to
	any further transfer of village assets to this trust.
	I attended a public meeting in a packed village hall on
	25 th April. This was, as far as I am aware, the first
	consultation with the community. As representatives
	from Dumfries and Galloway Council and the newly
	formed Portpatrick Development Trust were invited, I
	expected to be able to ask questions about this transfer.
	Unfortunately, no representatives from either Dumfries
	and Galloway Council or the Portpatrick Community
	Development Trust saw fit to attend so lack of
	consultation with the community continues to be an
	issue. The Portpatrick Community Development Trust
	would appear to be acting without consulting the village
	and ignoring attempts at communication e.g. the
	meeting.
	During the meeting, the overwhelming majority of those
	attending the meeting voted in objection to the intention of
	Portpatrick Community Development Trust to take over the
	village hall or pursue any further village assets.

	was happening. Also, no notice of any meetings to discuss
	this. I feel they should have gone through the Community
	Council so the whole Village could be included.
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	I believe they are not just interested in the Village Hall but
	other parts of the Village.

	consultation of the Portpatrick Community. A general meeting

This recently formed Trust has little credibility within the community of Portpatrick. Having formed without any community consultation and having subsequently refused to engage in public meetings around the future of the Hall when invited by other bodies. They have attained little respect for their actions and most certainly cannot claim to represent the community of Portpatrick whom have voiced very clearly their displeasure with them through a petition against them of over 200 signatures to date. I would like to extend our full support to the actions of the Portpatrick Harbour Community Benefit Society and Community Council whom together have represented and engaged the community of Portpatrick in a most admirable manner. Furthermore, wish to confirm our full support for the application made by Portpatrick Harbour Community Benefit Society for full asset transfer of Portpatrick Village Hall into their ownership. The Society has a proven track record to date, already having secured two previous asset transfers for the community. The level of community engagement and subsequent benefit derived from their charitable objects both speak clearly for work of the charity. We can only admire the current state of Portpatrick Harbour which under their management has become a much better and vibrant environment. We very much depend on such reputable groups for support in carrying out our work. We are however deeply concerned to learn of the current situation with regard to Portpatrick Village Hall. We do not think that Portpatrick Community Development Trust are in a position to do this.
	We also have serious concerns about this valuable community asset being handed over to a Development Trust which was formed in secret, without openness and transparency, against the wishes of Portpatrick Community Council, without any community engagement. To date they have not engaged in any community consultation, although they have been invited to attend public meetings called by the Community Council to discuss the future of the Village Hall.
	PCC called a public meeting in April 2019 which was attended by around 100 members of the community and resulted in a 180 signature petition being produced which was directly against PCDT.
	Therefore to safeguard the Village Hall and to carry out the wishes of our wider community, Portpatrick Community Council cannot support this application.
