POVERTY AND INEQUALITIES IN SCHOOLS AND YOUTH GROUPS

So what is poverty? How can we better understand inequality?

Our commitment is that every Primary and Secondary School and Youth Groups will deliver a minimum of one session with children and young people surrounding poverty and inequalities during Challenge Poverty Week.

Session plans designed by the Poverty Alliance will give staff and volunteers the information they need to deliver workshops and activity-based learning with children and young people in both informal and formal learning environments. Our goal is to challenge the stigma and raise understanding surrounding poverty and inequalities through conversation.

Classes and groups are encouraged to document their learning and share their stories to be entered into a prize draw to win £100 to a local cause of their choosing.
