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| Clean DG | Can the Council do more to encourage and support town and village cleans with community groups? | The Council already support local voluntary groups by provide bags, gloves, litter pickers and then collecting rubbish after community litter picks. The Community Assets Team are happy to work with any group within our communities. |

| | Could the streets in Glentrool not be swept as often? | The Community Assets Team are happy to discuss this further with the local community. |
| | Could grass be cut less/not cut to give local wildlife a chance? | The Community Asset Team are happy to work with any community to reduce or stop grass cutting in certain areas. There are already good examples of this partnership working across the region e.g. Glentrool to support the butterfly population and Stranraer to support the bee population. |
| Community Collaboration | Would it be possible to set up an Incredible Edibles type group in Wigtown and potentially look at the following? • Fruit trees in cemeteries? • Planting on Council land? | Officers are happy to meet the community to help develop this organisation and give permission for use of Council owned ground where appropriate. Contact details of the Stranraer Incredible Edible have been passed to the community. |
