

**PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE CONDITIONS:**  
**PUBLIC PERFORMANCE OF ANY PLAYS**

1. The licence holder shall display the licence in a prominent position at the main entrance to the premises where it shall be easily read by members of the public and shall ensure that it is not in any way altered, erased or defaced in any way.
2. The licence holder shall ensure that a Fire Safety Risk Assessment is in place to the satisfaction of the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and takes into account fully the terms of the document "Practical Fire Safety Guidance for Existing Non-Residential Premises" attached to these conditions.
3. The licence holder shall ensure that suitable written operating and emergency procedures, as agreed with the relevant Statutory Agencies, are in place and that all staff and employees fully understand required procedures.
4. The licence holder shall ensure that the use of a working telephone or another method of calling/contacting Police Scotland, the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and other emergency services is provided at the premises and that all staff and employees are aware of its location.
5. The licence holder shall ensure that all areas of the premises are accessible at all times to the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, Police Scotland and other relevant Statutory Agencies including an authorised Officer of Dumfries and Galloway Council and shall permit entry by said Agencies at all times.
6. The licence holder shall ensure that the premises comply with the requirements of the Health and Safety at Work, etc Act 1974 and associated legislation including the Workplace (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations 1992,, the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 and all other relevant Regulations.
7. If the premises are used by any third parties (being an individual and/or organisation other than the licence holder), the licence holder shall ensure that an induction of the premises is conducted to include information on fire safety procedures, means of escape and calling the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service.
8. If the event includes the use of temporary raised structures such as a stage, grandstand or platform the licence holder shall ensure that a permit under Section 89 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 has been obtained in advance of the staging of the event.
